

# 032.0/ AABA Homegrounds


## 01 Description

AABA Homeground is a sports ground designed to be used by schools or local councils, for educational and recreational use. The sports ground consists of the pitch and of a specially designed enclosure, which contains the goals and can be used as seating for a limited amount of spectators.

Generally the biggest problem for outdoor sports areas are the weather conditions which make the unprotected grounds difficult to use for a significant amount of time during the year, the weather is unpredictable.

An indoor sports hall is the usual solution to dealing with inclement weather, though this is an extremely expensive solution compared to the cost of a covered outdoor sports ground. A sports hall does not allow for spontaneous recreational use, as the building will be locked whenever it is not used officially.


Youmeheshe proposes the construction of a lightweight roof to protect the sports ground from weather influences. The roof will be an economic solution and will allow the use of the sports ground throughout the year.
